

Bishop's Reflection ~ December 2023

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Advent Season and the light that it brings begs us to turn to God for his consolation, and it challenges us to comfort others "who are in trouble." This recommendation of St. Paul to the Corinthians is also meant for us, especially during this holy season of expectation and hope. With Advent, we begin a new liturgical year, and one of the clarion proclamations, expressed in word and song is: "Comfort, comfort My people." Is. 40:1

This heavenly consolation and comfort begins with a God who loves and is concerned with our well-being: "the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies." It is in the Person of the Messiah, Jesus, that we have received: Light, consolation, and hope. As we embrace this truth, we must persevere in knowing that the Father comforts us in all of our afflictions as he did with his Son, Jesus. Even during Jesus' terrible passion and death, in the midst of experiencing the darkness of abandonment, Jesus persevered and trusted his merciful Father.

During these uncertain times of wars and violence, hatred, lawlessness, and division, in the midst of all of this, we, too, can experience an oppressive sense of abandonment. It is a darkness that can settle over us in order to disillusion and rob us of hope. But we must be reassured that God, the Father of Mercies, has not abandoned us.

We, during this Advent season, need to be a people of hope. Once we are secure in hope, then we can be true instruments of encouragement and consolation to our brothers and sisters who are fearful and who are struggling in this life. As we share and unite our afflictions to those of Christ, so in Christ we will "share abundantly in his consolation."

May the holy season of Light, consolation and comfort prepare, strengthen, and illuminate our minds and hearts as we await the Coming of Jesus. During this Advent and Christmas Season let us welcome Him, He who is Comfort, who was sent by the Father-Emmanuel! "Let us be comforted!" "Let us embrace the Light!"

Reflexión del Obispo ~ Diciembre 2023

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas:

El tiempo de Adviento y la luz que trae, nos ruega que nos volvamos a Dios en busca de su consuelo, y nos desafía a consolar a otros "que están en tribulaciones". Esta recomendación de San Pablo a los Corintios también está destinada a nosotros, especialmente durante este tiempo santo de espera y esperanza. Con el Adviento, comenzamos un nuevo año litúrgico, y una de las proclamaciones de clarín, expresada en palabras y cantos es: "Consuela, consuela a Mi pueblo". Isaías 40:1

Este consuelo celestial comienza con un Dios que ama y se preocupa por nuestro bienestar: "el Padre de nuestro Señor Jesucristo, el Padre de las misericordias". Es en la Persona del Mesías, Jesús, que hemos recibido: Luz, consuelo y esperanza. Al abrazar esta verdad, debemos perseverar en saber que el Padre nos consuela en todas nuestras aflicciones como lo hizo con su Hijo Jesús. Incluso durante la terrible pasión y muerte de Jesús, en medio de la experiencia de la oscuridad del abandono, Jesús perseveró y confió en su Padre misericordioso.

Durante estos tiempos inciertos de guerras y violencia, odio, anarquía y división, en medio de todo esto, nosotros también podemos experimentar una sensación opresiva de abandono. Es una oscuridad que puede instalarse sobre nosotros para desilusionarnos y robarnos la esperanza. Pero debemos estar seguros de que Dios, el Padre de las Misericordias, no nos ha abandonado.

Nosotros, durante este tiempo de Adviento, necesitamos ser un pueblo de esperanza. Una vez que estamos seguros en la esperanza, entonces podemos ser verdaderos instrumentos de aliento y consuelo para nuestros hermanos y hermanas que tienen miedo y que están luchando en esta vida. A medida que compartimos y unimos nuestras aflicciones a las de Cristo, así en Cristo, "participaremos abundantemente en su consolación".

Que el tiempo santo de Luz, consolación y consuelo, el Adviento, prepare, fortalezca e ilumine nuestras mentes y corazones mientras esperamos la Venida de Jesús. Durante este tiempo de Adviento y Navidad, jacojámonos a Él, que es el Consuelo, que fue enviado por el Padre-Emmanuel! "¡Dejémonos consolar!" "¡Abracemos la Luz!"




